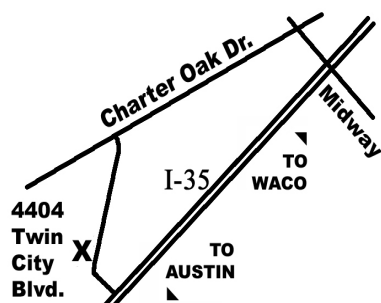

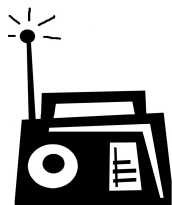

Shall we continue to *be lovers of money* so that grace may abound? Certainly not!

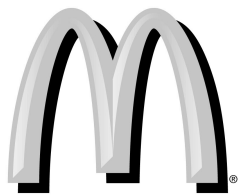
Shall we continue to *serve self and neglect others* so that grace may abound? Certainly not!
